What is a collocation?

In English, we have the habit of using certain words together more often than others. These words that appear together are called collocations.

Why are collocations important?

It is important to master collocations, as they will make your speech sound more natural. When you use collocations, your speech will be idiomatic; meaning you will sound more like a native speaker.

Examples of common collocations

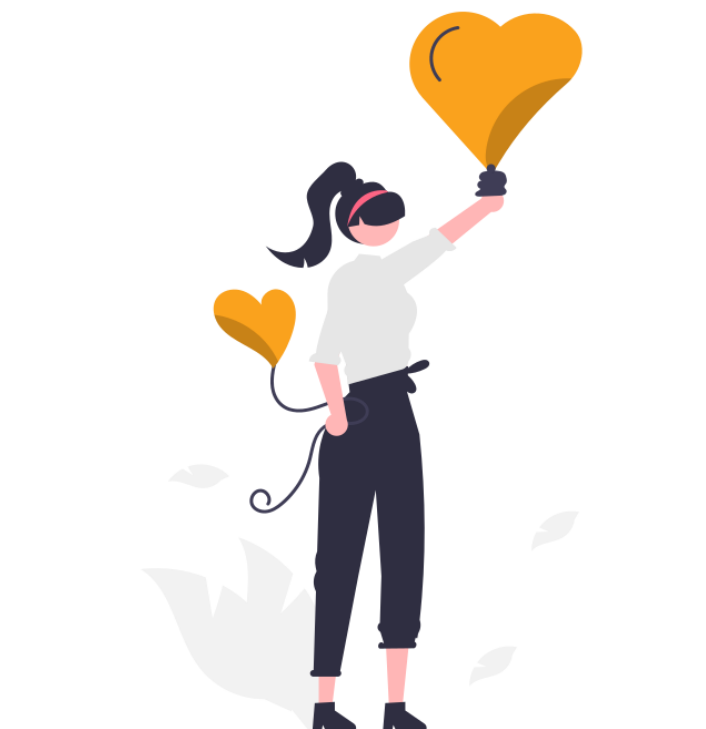
He needs to **do homework** tonight.

Let's take the subway - it'll **save time**.

If I cook, you need to **do the dishes**.

I'm going to ask him to **give me advice**.

Some people don't **take** enough **risks** in life.
